Ms Sophia Casanova

Sophia Casanova is a PhD candidate at the University of New South Wales. Her body of research, with its focus on the investigation of glacial landforms on Mars, has attracted strong interest from NASA and SpaceX. Her work in identifying large accessible water deposits on the planet is currently contributing to the design of imminent space missions.

Sophia's work experiences as a geologist have been as exciting and varied as the landscapes she has explored, taking her from the investigation of deep-sea volcanoes off the coast of New Zealand to the isolated gas fields of outback Queensland. Spending a year at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL), in Pasadena in the United States working alongside Mars mission planners, has been a career highlight to date.

Sophia is on the Board of the National Space Society of Australia. She adores living in Sydney and is excited by the emerging opportunities for Australian scientists to cement our nation's place in space.

Farewell to the College Chair

There are many ways to measure the stature of a man but, as Dominicans, we do so by turning to St Dominic for our yardstick.

Dominic has been described as *having swept away centuries of medievalism, and long-established traditions of hierarchical governance to open out a way of being, a democracy that demanded the participation of every single person for it to be effective. In this way, Dominic established a way of innate freedom and trust*.* Dominic would have been proud of Tony Woods. Under Tony's chairmanship, the governing body of Santa Sabina College never failed to pursue independent decision making through freedom of thought and imbued collegial trust.

Good governance demands *right relationship between power, authority, and responsibility**. Tony exhibited all those three qualities in a very human way. The Board of Directors never failed to see their Chair as their leader, invested with his positional authority but also carrying his mission responsibility into all matters, whether they were financial oversight, formation, strategic planning, or duty of care.

Dominic set up a form of governance with community in mind. The Santa Sabina community was at the heart of everything Tony did. Service to community, love of community and engagement with community were critical values and practices underpinning Tony's leadership. Countless College events were attended by Tony as

Board Chair, not just from role delegation but from an inherent sense of identity as the person responsible for good governance and corporate leadership.

A fine achievement of Tony's Board leadership in the context of community was the creation of opportunity for alumni to engage with the Santa Sabina College community by contributing to the Santa Sabina College Foundation. Tony's work in establishing the Foundation, putting a structure around philanthropy, and giving it a legal framework, was significant. Further to this, Tony and the Board were never daunted by funding restraints and challenges and dared to dream in the Master Planning landscape.

In the Dominican tradition, everyone has authority, everyone is called to be accountable and responsible in a democracy of constant dialogue: from the Master of the Order to school ministry Board Directors. Tony always understood this and led with his Board members whilst acknowledging that his role carried ultimate responsibility. Tony's intrinsic understanding of governance gave him perspective at all times and offered the College a respectful relationship between operational and governance.

The system of Governance established by Dominic is democratic in principle, spiritual in depth and for the common good*. So while many can cast an eye over the Santa Sabina campus and point to edifices and projects that the Board approved and developed in Tony's era as a director, Tony Woods' real legacy will be community and right relationship, sound strategic and master planning, loyalty, companionship, and support in difficult times.
